PostScript output, using outline fonts, was produced using Radical Eye Software's dvips(k) 5.85, and printed on an HP LaserJet 4000 TN printer at 1200dpi.

We had a PostScript problem with one graphic image which was a TIFF image converted by tiff2ps—this image would not print on any of our HP printers, but would print on our old QMS printer—the interpreter being more forgiving on this machine. Can you identify the article in which this occured?

I hope to have the TEX Live 5 installation completed soon and the next issue should be produced using this year's version of TEX Live!
